PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The conclusion of 2023 and into 2024 was a period of increased opportunities following the resilient efforts to rebuild and upgrade Guam Football Association - both structurally and technically on the pitch.

Following the devastating effects of Typhoon Mawar in May 2023, GFA was in complete disarray, with the destruction of six of the Harmon facility's nine light poles, structural damage to buildings, surface damage to pitches, and other areas that delayed a return-to-play for Guam's football athletes. With the diligent efforts of the Guam FA staff and community, Guam National Program training and leagues began a little over a month later in limited conditions.

Despite the challenges brought on from the typhoon, Guam FA successfully delivered a home match of the FIFA World Cup 26 Qualifiers of the Asian Zone on Oct. 17, 2023 featuring the Matao against visiting Singapore, and later, was the venue for a weeklong training camp for the Masakåda, before the team traveled to China, PR for the EAFF E-1 Football Championship Women's Competition.

On Dec. 3, 2023, Guam welcomed FIFA President Gianni Infantino to the island for the first time, with his visit coinciding with Gupot GFA 2023, a fun, end-of-the-year event for Guam FA's member clubs. While in Guam, FIFA President Infantino marveled at the resiliency of the community in rebuilding following Typhoon Mawar and confirmed FIFA's support via the FIFA Foundation Recovery Program for up to \$547,218 for the restoration and installation of a new solar panel system and engineering work for the replacement of floodlights to continue night-time operations.

By August 2024, Guam FA enjoyed the installation of a new solar panel system with new technology for increased cost savings and also finalized the groundbreaking of the Speaker Vicente Pangelinan Southern Complex facility in Hågat. The new facility will be home to two full-size turf pitches and provide additional opportunities for football activities, primarily benefitting Guam's southern clubs and schools.

Although we haven't fully recovered from Typhoon Mawar, we are on track to upgrade the GFA National Training Center in Harmon, while working to complete the construction of the Speaker Vicente Pangelinan Southern Complex in Hågat, as well as other properties in Ordot-Chalan Pago and Talofofo. We are already seeing the increasing popularity of many grassroots programs, including the GFA Football 4 Schools program featuring 24 of Guam's elementary schools, with more requesting to join. The sport's popularity will only increase with access to multiple world-class facilities all over the island.

In addition to infrastructure upgrades, elite youth football development also is strengthening for our island's young athletes. With the consistency of available coaching courses, referee courses, and full immersion in FIFA's Talent Development Scheme, Guam's athletes will be better equipped to compete internationally and in higher-level leagues abroad. I have full trust in Guam FA's Technical Department and High Performance team to ensure accelerated development in our athletes and coaches and look forward to continued success globally for Guam's teams.

All of this is only possible with the collaboration of Guam FA's stakeholders - the Guam FA Member Clubs, the athletes, coaches, referees, administrators, Executives, staff, the Government of Guam, local business sponsors, supporters, and volunteers.

Thank you to all who have contributed to Guam FA over the years and may we all continue to work together toward success in the coming year - our 50th Anniversary year - and onward.

GENERAL SECRETARY'S MESSAGE

Particularly in the past year, Guam Football Association's theme has been measurable progress. Halfway through GFA's four-year strategic plan, we have managed to hit many targets.

In National Teams development, we have set a standard to invest in homegrown coaches to lead our teams in international competition. Ross Awa took the helm of the Matao and led the team through the first round of Asian Qualifiers of the FIFA World Cup 26. For a few months, former Guam resident Kristin Thompson was at the helm of the Masakåda for two tournaments: the EAFF E-1 Football Championship Women's Competition in China, PR in November 2023 and the WAFF Women's Championship Saudi 2024 in Saudi Arabia in February 2024.

At the grassroots level, we are steadily increasing participation in the sport, with the expansion of current opportunities beginning with the GFA Football 4 Schools program, which now features close to 500 athletes from 24 different elementary schools. Additionally, GFA has developed closer relationships with IIAAG and ISA, and for the first time since 2019, succeeded in unifying the high school football leagues previously run separately by the school sports entities.

In competition development, we are moving toward establishing a regional club tournament. Midway through December 2023, local champion Wings FC traveled to Saipan to compete in the Marianas Club Championship pilot tournament, competing against Eleven Tiger FC, champions of NMI Football Association's Marianas Soccer League 1.

In the first part of 2024, we officially rebranded Guam's top-flight domestic leagues, introducing the Budweiser G League and the Bud Light G League Women. A total of 15 teams contested the first-ever Budweiser G League title, with Wings FC rising above the NAPA Rovers FC in an exciting final in September 2024. The first-ever champions of the Bud Light G League Women will be crowned in late October 2024.

In the Education realm, at least one GFA "C" Coaching Certificate Course has been held each year, with the aim to hold a GFA "B" Coaching Certificate Course by 2025 and to achieve membership into the AFC Coaching Convention. The GFA Referees Department has consistently held at least ten Referee Courses at various levels in 2023 and again in 2024.

In Marketing Strategy, we have formalized the official GU Football Fan shop, with authentic National Team jerseys as its top selling items. Additionally, GFA revamped its sponsorship structure based on leagues and events, and have succeeded in securing partners for Guam's top domestic leagues, the Robbie Webber Youth League, and GFA Football 4 Schools, among others, with more work in progress. Additionally, we were able to offer more in GFA Scholarship money in 2024 for our student-athletes, from \$11,000 in the first year to over \$14,000 for Class of 2024 graduates and college students.

In August 2024, we held two key events: the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the installation of GFA's new solar energy system, which will realize additional annual cost savings for the GFA National Training Center in Harmon, and the groundbreaking ceremony for the Speaker Vicente Pangelinan Southern Complex in Hågat. The cost savings, as well as the additional southern facility, will equate to more sporting opportunities for the local community.



FIFA President Gianni Infantino and a group of FIFA delegates visited Guam for the first time on December 3, 2023, with a day-long itinerary that included a lunch meeting with Guam's key government officials, an appearance at the awards presentation for Guam's adult domestic leagues and Gupot GFA 2023 Block Party - a grassroots event for clubs, and a bilateral meeting with GFA Executives to discuss Guam football achievements and support to rebuild after the destruction of Typhoon Mawar in May 2023. The FIFA delegation also played in a football match with players from Guam's domestic leagues.

During the bilateral meeting, it was announced that GFA's application for additional funding and support via the FIFA Foundation Recovery Program up to \$547,218 was approved for the restoration and installation of a new solar panel system and floodlights to regain from the typhoon.

"So, it was a fantastic day here in Guam for me, the first time I've visited this beautiful country," Infantino said. "Guam is a fantastic country. Football is the number one sport here and we have to say that loud and clear. I visited, of course, the headquarters and we discussed with the government that we are helping together to rebuild what the typhoon earlier this year destroyed.

"Congratulations to my dear friend Tino, the President of the Guam Football Association and his entire team. They're doing a fantastic job, as well as all coaches, girls and boys playing football here. It was a great pleasure, a great honor for me. It was my first time here, but definitely not the last time. Everyone should come to Guam," Infantino added.





TECHNICAL: MEN'S



In October 2023, Guam's National Team, the Matao, returned to FIFA World Cup Qualifying with home and away matches against Singapore in the first round playoff.

Prior to the Oct. 12 away match, selected players were called up to a training camp in the Philippines with Head Coach Ross Awa, with the largest number of traveling staff at 10 for the 23-man squad.

Results:

- Singapore vs Guam in Singapore: 2-1 (Goal by Jason Cunliffe)
- Guam vs Singapore in Guam: 0-1

Singapore won the round on aggregate 3-1 and moved on to the second round of qualifying. Guam was eliminated from FIFA World Cup Qualifying three years before the tournament in 2026.

The Matao will return to action in the later part of 2024 with the return of the Preliminary Competition rounds of the East Asian Football Federation's flagship tournament, the E-1 Football Championship. In addition to Guam, the 2024 EAFF tournament's preliminary competition will include Chinese Taipei, DPR Korea, Hong Kong China, Macau China, Mongolia, and Northern Mariana Islands.

The Guam U20 National Team competed in two tournaments in 2024: the U20 Marianas Cup in Saipan in August and the AFC U20 Asian Cup 2025 Qualifiers in Vietnam in September.

The Guam U17 Women's National Team accepted an invitation from the Saudi Arabian Football Federation to take part in a training camp and matches against the Saudi Arabia U17 Women's National Team in April 2024. Guam's team traveled to Dammam, Saudi Arabia and played their Saudi Arabian counterparts twice at the Prince Mohammed Bin Fahad Bin Abdulaziz Stadium.

TECHNICAL: WOMEN'S

Guam's U15 Women's National Team boasted a notable run in the EAFF U15 Women's Championship 2024 in Dalian, China PR, finishing second place in Group B with a 3-1 record in the August competition.

Guam shut out its first three opponents - Mongolia, Macau-China, and Northern Mariana Islands - scoring six goals in four matches and finished with a goal differential of +3 at the conclusion of the tournament.

TECHNICAL: COACHES

A total of 11 coaches earned their GFA "C" Coaching Diploma after successfully completing all requirements of the 2023-2024 course and passing all required written and practical examinations. The 11 coaches are Anthony Simon, Brandon Sana, Shaun Martinez, Jon Barnhart, Anwah Jameson, Lily Concepcion, Barbara Sana, Carla Rios, John Cruz, Kristian Cruz, and Ciara Nauta.

The next GFA "C" Coaching Diploma Course began in April 2024 and concluded its third module before the end of July 2024. The third module included final practical and written examinations.

The GFA Technical Department also successfully held a GFA Youth Coaching Certificate Course (YCC) and a GFA "D" Coaching Certificate Course in January 2024. Beginning in the Fall season of 2024, all U12 Competitive Division coaches must have at least a GFA "D" Coaching Certificate or its equivalent.

In February, the GFA Technical Department held the year's first GFA Goalkeeping Coaching Certificate Course.







TECHNICAL: COACHES






Coaches in the 2024 edition of the GFA "C" Coaching Diploma Course completed Module 3 sessions and examinations July 20, with the rest of the year to submit updated coaching logs.

The GFA Technical Department also held its second GFA Youth Coaching Certificate Course (YCC) and a GFA "D" Coaching Certificate Course of the year in August 2024.

A record-high number of 27 coaches registered and particiated in the August 2024 YCC Course, with the majority continuing to the GFA "D" Coaching Certificate Course.









TECHNICAL: DEVELOPMENT

Seleted players from the Guam U15 Academy competed in the 2024 Copa Toreros tournament in Shizuoka, Japan from March 25 to 27 against their peers on club teams. Guam's team played against FC Basara Hyogo and Ventforet Kofu, and Yokogawa Musashino club teams from Japan and also Gwangju FC from Korea Republic. The tournament also featured youth club teams from Europe. Guam FA Technical Director Ross Awa accompanied the team as Head Coach.

In Guam, Guam Football Association welcomed the U16 Girls team from Tokyo Football Association for a training camp that included a mini tournament with club teams on March 24 and a training match against Guam's U17 Women's National Team on March 25.

A total of five club teams took part in the mini tournament with their peers from Tokyo Football Association: ASC Trust Islanders FC, Bank of Guam Strykers FC, Guam Shipyard Wolverines, NAPA Rovers FC, and Tumon Typhoons FC.

Tumon Typhoons FC played in the tournament's final match against the Tokyo FA U16 Girls Team, dropping the match 0-4 in favor of the visiting team.

The following day, the Tokyo FA U16 Girls team returned to the Guam Football Association National Training Center for a training match against the Guam U17 Women's National Team. Tokyo FA's team on 7-2 in the contest.











TECHNICAL: DEVELOPMENT











In 2024, technical development also was prioritized at the club level.

With a handful of clubs working with finalized multi-year strategic plans and other clubs working toward finalizing plans, GFA Technical Director Ross Awa assisted clubs in determining their individual club philosophies and brand as a basis for sustainable development through a collective workshop.

The link to Guam's National Program also was discussed, as well as the pivotal role clubs play in young athletes' development to reach their potential. Both elite coach and player pathways were presented, as well as recreational pathways based on each club's vision and mission.

Following the workshop attended by club technical directors and club administrators, a separate workshop was held solely with club Technical Directors. More emphasis on technical development at the club level was presented to club Technical Directors, who are tasked to oversee their respective coaches database and encourage more club coaches to earn their licenses to raise the level of football in indidivual clubs.



January 2024 saw the re-branding of Guam's top flight domestic leagues to the Budweiser G League for men's teams and the Bud Light G-League Women for women's teams.

A total of 15 teams entered the men's competition and 11 teams entered the women's competition at the beginning of the 2024 season.

The men's competition will run through three rounds of regular season play, with the top four teams from overall standings moving on to a single elimination playoff to determine the 2024 champion. Wings FC defeated NAPA Rovers FC 3-2 to win the league's first-ever title.

Thirteen of GFA Member Clubs, as all as the Andersen Bombers SC, play in the 2024 Fall season: Crushers FC, Dededo SC, ASC Trust Islanders FC, Quality Distributors, NAPA Rovers FC, Sidekick SC, Southern Cobras, GTA Southern Heat, Bank of Guam Strykers FC, Tiger FC, Tumon Typhoons FC, Wings FC, and Guam Shipyard Wolverines.

The league continues for ten weeks, concluding Nov. 16 with the season-ending Jamboree.

Beginning in the first part of 2024, Guam FA officially took over the effective management of the Interscholastic Girls High School Football League, which featured 11 school teams: 6 public and 5 private schools.

Previously, school administrators from the two school categories created their own separate leagues, which essentially divided the over high school level player pool and limited competitiveness.

The league featured 63 matches in two months, including 8 playoff matches. The John F. Kennedy High School Islanders played against the Southern High School Dolphins for the 2024 championship title, with the Islanders winning 2-1. Guam High School won the third place match with a 5-1 victory over Harvest Christian Academy Eagles.

The final two matches were played at the GFA National Training Center. For the first time, GFA utilized its new mobile giant screen with player graphics, score, and match time. The screen will be offered to local businesses as an advertising tool during GFA's large events. The league's championship match attracted close to 1,000 spectators. Tickets were available for purchase online.









Masters football also received a re-branding effort in 2024, resulting in the new Ma'gas Masters League and Ma'gas Co-Ed Master League.

The 2023-2024 Ma'gas Masters League was contested by seven teams and officially concluded May 12, 2024. The seven teams were Eurocar Sidekick SC, FC Pride DSC, Bank of Guam Strykers Masters, Southern Heat IT&E Boonie Dawgs, Gino's Islanders FC, Guam Shipyard Big Blue Masters, and Tumon Typhoons FC Masters.

GRASSROOTS

The GFA Football 4 Schools program continued in 2024 with the theme "Respetu" or respect in English. Following the success of the 2023 program, a total of 24 elementary schools once again participated in the program, which culminated in the school-year ending Jamboree, featuring festival style matches for all school teams.

In addition to the Jamboree, the local program also included regional round-robin matches leading up to the Jamboree and a social responsibility component that featured presentations at participating schools by program partners Guam Police Department and Guam Airport Police, as well as youth national team athletes. The program also included equipment donation to the participating schools at the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year.

In total, over 500 took part in the athletic component of the GFA Football for Schools program. Each participating school featured a separate boys team and a girls team. iLearn Elementary School won the girls' division and Talofofo Elementary School won the boys' division.

Later in the spring, GFA celebrated AFC Grassroots Football Day with an introduction to walking football for teams in the recreational Ma'gas Masters League and Ma'gas Co-Ed Masters League.













As part of Guam Football Association's commitment to providing football opportunities for all players and to promote football as a lifelong sport, the GFA Football Events Department introduced walking football to the local community as part of Guam's celebration of AFC Grassroots Football Day, held Saturday May 25, 2024.

Seven men's and women's teams, with players from Guam's domestic adult recreational leagues, gave in to their curiosity and learned about the game, which although played at a slower pace, quick decision making and overall skills were needed.

As the sport was newly introduced in Guam, it also attracted many from the community who don't play in domestic leagues to try. Close to five percent of participants were not currently playing in any of Guam's domestic leagues, but have plans to join other leagues offered by Guam FA.

Guam kicked off its month-long celebration of AFC Women's Football Day on March 10, 2024 with the 15th Annual Girls Middle School Football Festival, supported by Japan Football Association. The long-standing event, for the island's middle school athletes, is always held in the early part of March to coincide with Guam's International Women's Day and AFC Women's Football Day celebration.

In Guam, the interscholastic league for middle schools is split - one caters to Guam's public schools and the other caters to Guam's private and charter schools. The Sugar and Spice festival brings both leagues together in a day of football for interleague play among teams. This year, the event featured 16 different school teams, each with on average 20 players on their playing rosters. The event attracts over 300 girls to play at the GFA National Training Center.

The St. John's School Knights repeated as champions in the annual festival.

The event attracts over 200 girls to play, as well as school spirit clubs and photographers, at the GFA National Training Center.

In 2024, GFA once again organized equipment donations to schools taking part in the year's edition of GFA Football 4 Schools, while also donating equipment to Guam's high schools taking part in the newly combined Interscholastic Girls High Sschool Football League. Equipment included footballs, mini goals, cones, and markers.

Ahead of the 2024 GFA Football 4 Schools Jamboree, together with the Guam Police Department and Guam Airport Police, GFA visited all participating elementary schools to deliver the year's message about respect.

The program message was tied to GFA's Respetu Campaign, first introduced in the Spring 2024 season of the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League. Emphasis on "respetu" or respect in English, aimed to improve the overall game environment by minimalizing disrespectful and discriminatory language and boosting the spirit of fair play. Special signage was created and installed at the GFA National Training Center in Harmon.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY













Guam's youth national teams took part in various wellness workshops in 2024 with Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center and the Guam Police Department.

In the summer months, GBHWC's Focus on Life team were on site at GFA to deliver interactive presentations on suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention, with the objective to promote good mental health on top of physical well being.

"We know that for youth, the best spokespeople are other youth, and the national team athletes are the best kind of ambassadors to influence their peers on and off the pitch. I hope that with workshops from these outreach programs, they'll begin to prioritize their mental health as much as their physical health in their development in the sport and help relay this message to others."


In the fall months, Sgt. Paul Tapao introduced Guam Police Department's initiative, "Substance-Free Athletics," weekly seminars for Guam's youth national teams to learn about identifying illegal substances and understanding the science behind their detrimental and impairing effects, as well as the negative social effects.

"Substance-Free Athletics" is part of a wider outreach program by GPD, mainly for younger audiences and their parents, coaches, and teachers. Guam Football Association's National Training Center in Harmon was not spared from the devastating effects of Typhoon Mawar in late May 2023. The damaging winds destroyed the facility's solar panel system, lifting panels off from rooftops and crashing across walkways and pitches. The winds also uprooted six of the facility's nine floodlight poles and sent the newly installed lighting system crashing onto the competition pitches, damaging the field's turf and littering broken glass on the surface. The winds also structurally damaged the facility's building, which were the priority for repair.

GFA President Valentino San Gil and GFA Executives went to work to secure funding to repair damage and procure another solar panel system and floodlights to return GFA back to its rate of activity prior to the typhoon. For over a year, GFA's programs were limited to daytime activities, yet without the solar panel system in place, electricity bills were not decreasing.







INFRASTRUCTURE

Midway through 2024, GFA's solar energy system at the GFA National Training Center in Harmon was completely replaced, thanks in great part by a financial grant from FIFA Foundation. A ribbon cutting ceremony was held August 8, 2024 to celebrate the completion of the project by Pacific Solar & Photovoltaics, which now features more technologically advanced solar energy panels and an upgraded monitoring tool for cost savings.

The new solar energy system at GFA consists of 264 solar panels with an anticipated production of 98.4 kilowatts of energy.

Additionally, engineering work continues for the restoration of floodlights. Newer, more cost efficient lighting systems will be installed and poles able to withstand greater wind force levels have been procured and installed to better protect the system during typhoons.








INFRASTRUCTURE







Guam Football Association ceremonially broke ground August 8, 2024 to signal the realization of the Speaker Vicente Pangelinan Southern Complex in Hågat, a facility that will include two full-size artificial turf pitches and an international futsal hall in construction plans.

GFA secured \$5.2 million in funding from FIFA
Forward 3.0 after applying for infrastructure support
from FIFA and officially made the announcement at
a groundbreaking ceremony with over 50 in
attendance, including visiting FIFA Development
Officer Jun Chen, the Hon. Lou Leon Guerrero,
Governor of Guam, senators, mayors, the family of
the late Speaker Pangelinan, private sector VIPs, GFA
Executives, and club representatives from the
Southern Cobras and Southern Heat, among others.

Of the \$5.2 million, \$3.8 million was awarded to KIAN Construction for overall earthwork on the lot and \$770,873 for the installation of two turf pitches by Edel Grass B.V. \$413,966.71 was awarded to AM Orient for construction management and the remaining \$260,000 as a contingency.



GOVERNANCE & FINANCE

Guam Football Association last held its annual Ordinary
Congress in October 2023 at the Hyatt Regency Guam. During
the Congress, Guam Shipyard Wolverines' Peter Toves was
voted in as the newest GFA Executive Committee member,
with Fred Alig II, Kelley Barnhart, Duane Pahl, and Gian Tenorio
retaining their seats.

Also attending the EAFF Congress from Guam were Vice President George Lai, Executive Committee Member Duane Pahl and GFA General Secretary Joe Cepeda.









GOVERNANCE & FINANCE

GFA President Valentino San Gil, GFA Vice President George Lai, and GFA Executive Committee Member Gian Tenorio all attended the FIFA Congress held in May 2024 in Bangkok, Thailand, and the AFC Congress held also in Thailand.

FINANCE 2024

The AFC Central Review of funds disbursed during 2023 from the AFC Enhance Programme was conducted remotely by Annuit Consulting, based in Malaysia. The AFC auditor tested 100 percent of disbursements and gave a satisfactory rating (indicating no findings) across all 34 compliance checks.

The FIFA Central Review of funds disbursed during 2023 from the FIFA Forward 3.0 Development Programme was conducted remotely by FIFA central auditor Mazars USA LLP. The Central Review resulted in zero findings raised by the FIFA auditor.

For the tenth consecutive year, Guam FA successfully achieved a clean external audit opinion of its financial statements. In compliance with Guam Public Law 37-63, the audited financial statements were filed with the Guam Department of Revenue & Taxation (DRT) on August 19, 2024, and pursuant to Guam Public Law 27-85, Guam FA submitted its financial statements to GEDA, OPA, and the Guam Legislature on August 22, 2024.

Guam FA maintained good standing as a Guam 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization and was included in the DRT 2024 Updated Non-Profit Listing as of September 2024.







2024 CHAMPIONS

In October 2023, GFA renewed its annual partnership with Triple J Auto Group, naming rights sponsor of the twice yearly Robbie Webber Youth League and the GFA Football 4 Schools Program. As part of the agreement, Triple J Auto Group leased a 15 passenger van to GFA for use in transporting groups. The first group to utilize the 15 passenger van was the Masakåda, Guam Women's National Team, during its week-long training camp in Guam ahead of the EAFF E-1 Football Championship Women's Competition in China, PR.

In January 2024, community engagement increased with GFA's third edition of its Football 4 Schools program. The program attracted over a dozen sponsors, including Triple J Auto Group, Moda Gino's, Para'isu, Shirley's Coffee Shop, Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center, IT&E, Steel Athletics, Quick Bites, and Core Tech International among others.





MARKETING

In 2024, GFA's domestic leagues received a branding facelift implemented in the year's seasons.

The top flight leagues for men's and women's teams are now called G League and G League Women with Budwesier and Bud Light as naming rights sponsor, respectively. In addition to the rebranding, the league also was restructured, with the season featuring over 90 matches each and at least 10 teams.

In the recreational space, the Masters League is now called the Ma'gas Masters League and the summer Co-Ed Masters League is also under the Ma'gas name.

The former GFA Women's Recreational League is now called the Women's Recreational Latte League and the GFA Soccer Moms League is now called the Metgot Moms League.

The recreational names are from the Chamorro language:

- Ma'gas referring to the upper echelon of ancient Chamorro society
- Latte refers to the latte stone, which served as the structural foundation for ancient Chamorro houses
- Metgot refers to strength, in line with Guam's traditional matrilineal system that featured mothers at the head of the household in ancient Chamorro society

With GFA now at the helm of organizing schedules for the interscholastic high school leagues, uniting two separate leagues from previous years, new logos were created.


