This year marks the 50th Anniversary of Guam Football Association, commemorating the signing and filing of the organization's initial Articles of Incorporation with Department of Revenue and Taxation on May 15, 1975 and the official start to football we see today with our National Teams, domestic leagues, grassroots events, and others.

While the year continues to bustle with activity, including special events to celebrate the milestone year on top of annual events, the year also is a time of reflection, looking back to generations of success and development that all have contributed to where we stand today.

Many may remember some of Guam Football Association's humble beginnings, with Guam's first national teams competing in the South Pacific Games men's football competition in the 1970s. A couple of decades later, the sport grew exponentially in popularity and increased opportunities in Guam following membership into the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) in 1992, FIFA in 1996, and as a founding member of East Asian Football Federation (EAFF) in 2002. The GFA National Training Center in Harmon that we see today started as a vacant lot acquired through a lease agreement with the Government of Guam and through FIFA Goal Project funds and matching funds from the Government of Guam, the land was fully developed into GFA's headquarters, officially inaugurated in 2004.

Since 2004, the main competition pitches were converted to artificial turf pitches and expanded to include a mini pitch, futsal courts, a beach soccer court, a lecture hall, and fitness center among other upgrades.

The National Training Center is home to Guam's national teams, serving as the venue for international competitions including FIFA World Cup Qualifiers, AFC tournaments, EAFF tournaments, and other friendly matches and tournaments. The National Training Center also is home to GFA's domestic leagues, from the Budweiser G League and Bud Light G League Women at the top to our grassroots leagues, including the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League.

With the complete facility in Harmon, opportunities for the community grew and increased demand. Late last year, we held the official groundbreaking ceremony for the Speaker Vicente Pangelinan Southern Complex in Hagat, with other properties in line to also be developed to meet the demand for the sport's continued growth in Guam.



All the achievements thus far is the culmination of 50 years of hard work by the organization's pioneers to the current team and partnerships with various stakeholders, including decades of support from the Government of Guam and local businesses. As we look forward to more prosperous years for Guam football, we celebrate our history and build on past successes as continue working to elevate the sport in Guam even further.

Thank you to all who have been involved in the growth of football in Guam. The continued collaborative efforts of GFA's Member Clubs, the athletes, coaches, referees, administrators, Executives, staff, the Government of Guam, local business sponsors, supporters, and volunteers will keep the development of football in Guam in an upward trajectory in the coming year and onward.

In Guam Football Association's Golden Anniversary year, the organization has seen the continued refinement of successful programs and the addition of new avenues of involvement by the local community.

At the conclusion of 2024, the Matao, Guam National Team competed for the first time in the championship match of the EAFF E-1 Football Championship Preliminary Competition Round 2, contesting a spot in the final round of the tournament against Hong Kong, China. Although our East Asian neighbors eventually won the tournament the team's success came in the blending of both veteran players with several years of international experience and youth players called up to the senior team for the first time.

Following the departure of Kristin Thompson in the last part of 2024, Kimberly Sherman, another homegrown coach, was appointed as the Head Coach of the Masakåda, Guam Women's National Team and led the team to a bronze finish in Group # of the AFC Women's Asian Cup™ Australia 2026 Qualifiers in Vietnam.

Other national teams competing in 2025 are the Guam U23 National Team (September), Guam U20 Women's National Team (August), Guam U17 Women's National Team (October) and the Guam U17 National Team (November). Also included in Guam's National Program is Guam's first-ever foray into FIFAe competition, starting with the FIFAe World Cup 25™ featuring eFootball Console: Road to Riyadh in the last week of September and continuing with the tournament's Mobile version the first week of October, and finally with the Rocket League also this month.

Domestically, the GFA National Academy continues to develop with consistent competitive matches in leagues. The Guam U14 National Academy team competed in the U16 Boys Division of the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League Spring 2025 season, finishing in the top five. The team continued in the U17 Boys Division in the Fall 2025 season, finishing in second place in regular season standings. The Guam U14 Girls National Academy is currently competing in the U17 Girls Division of the Robbie Webber Youth League. Additionally, the Guam U16 National Academy team tasted competition in the Budweiser G League Haya Division.

The inclusion of the Academy teams in the leagues came from collective discussions with FIFA Talent Development Scheme coaches and has accelerated the development of the youth teams.

In the interscholastic leagues, GFA has successfully worked with IIAAG and ISA to combine both the Boys and Girls High School Interscholastic Leagues. GFA also supports both organizations in separate middle school leagues. At the elementary school level, GFA continues to organize its Football for Schools program, with the number of participating schools increasing to 25 from 16 in its inaugural year. Each school features separate boys and girls teams, and has contributed to the increase of teams at the U11 level in the 2025 Fall season of the Robbie Webber Youth League.

In addition to the annual events, GFA also successfully put on several celebratory events for the organization's 50th Anniversary, thanks to the collaboration of the GFA Marketing and Communications committee led by GFA Vice President Tina Esteves and the GFA 50th Anniversary sub-committee led by Jean Cepeda.

Thank you to all who have contributed to Guam's football initiatives - from projects completed in the current year to the pioneers who followed through with a vision 50 years ago to develop the sport in Guam to compete at the highest level. I invite you to view this year's Activity Report and relive all the highlights from a whirlwind of activity this year.

In 2024, technical development also was prioritized at the club level.

With a handful of clubs working with finalized multi-year strategic plans and other clubs working toward finalizing plans, GFA Technical Director Ross Awa assisted clubs in determining their individual club philosophies and brand as a basis for sustainable development through a collective workshop.



The link to Guam's National Program also was discussed, as well as the pivotal role clubs play in young athletes' development to reach their potential. Both elite coach and player pathways were presented, as well as recreational pathways based on each club's vision and mission.



Following the workshop attended by club technical directors and club administrators, a separate workshop was held solely with club Technical Directors. More emphasis on technical development at the club level was presented to club Technical Directors, who are tasked to oversee their respective coaches database and encourage more club coaches to earn their licenses to raise the level of football in individual clubs.

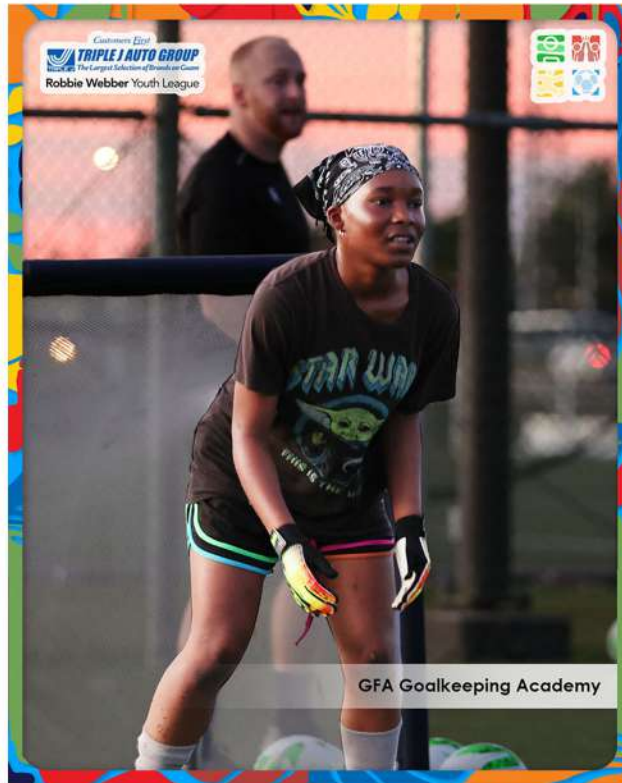

During the Spring 2025 season of the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League, GFA Goalkeeping Development Officer Jeroen Bos facilitated the new GFA Goalkeeper Academy program for youth goalkeepers playing in the U10 and U13 age divisions of the league.



In September, Ip Yik Wing joined GFA as the Goalkeeper Coach for the women's program and joined Bos in the next edition of the GFA Goalkeeper Academy, set up for goalkeepers in the U11 and U14 age divisions of the youth league.



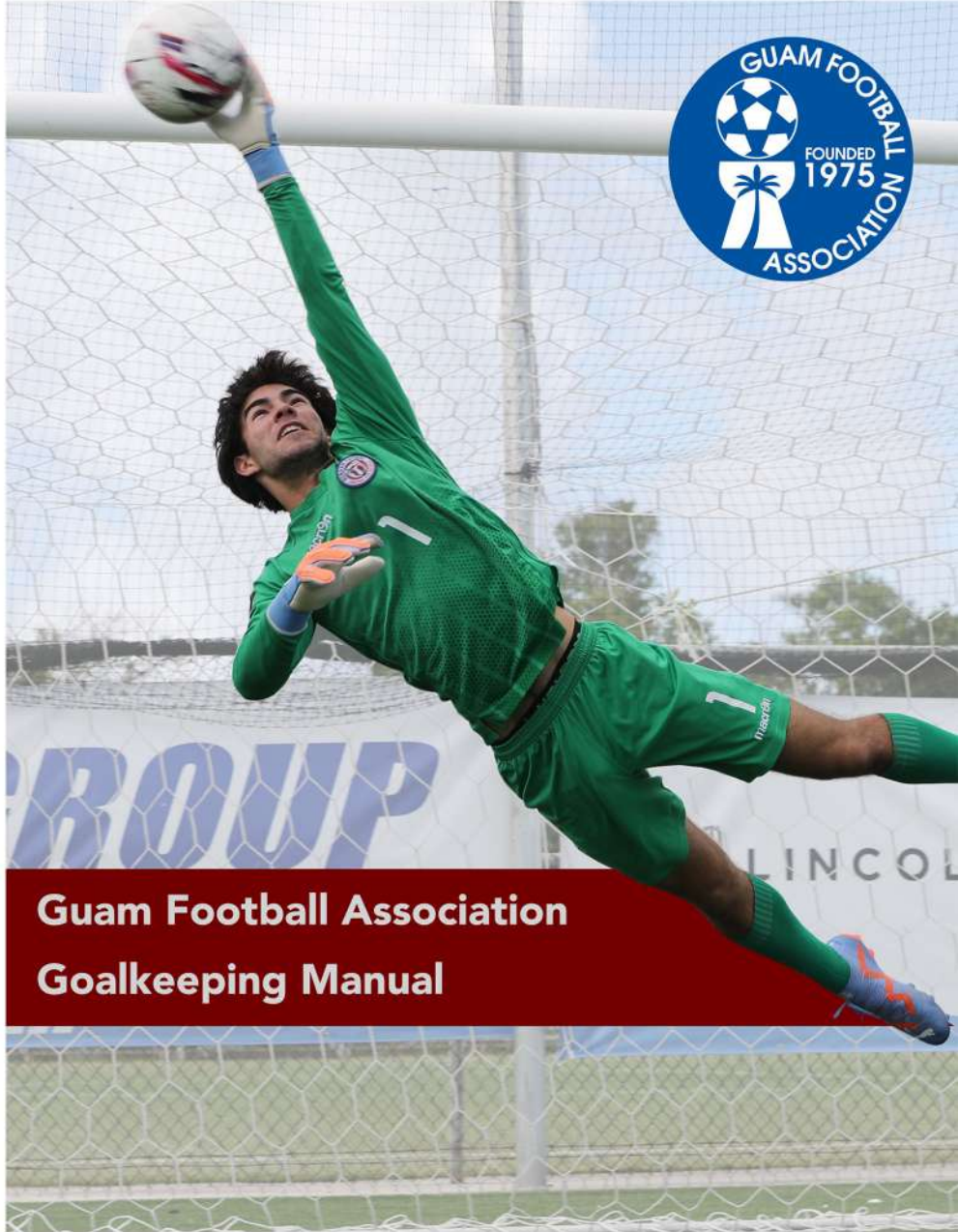
TECHNICAL: DEVELOPMENT

Midway through the Fall 2024 season of the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League, GFA Goalkeeping Development Officer Jeroen Bos created the Guam Football Association Goalkeeping Manual for Guam's national goalkeepers, club team goalkeepers, and their coaches.

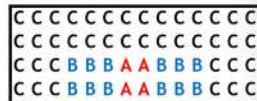
The manual included insight on the key traits and expectations of the modern goalkeeper, goalkeeper coach, and age appropriate key skills for goalkeepers. Included in the manual were sample exercises and drills.

In addition to goalkeeping development and support for clubs, former Guam Women's National Team Head Coach Kristin Thompson organized technical development sessions with various club presidents before her departure from Guam in September 2024.

The club development program was part of the initial round of funding from the FIFA Talent Development Scheme. The program started with support for the creation of strategic plans for member clubs with the support of expert Geoff Wilson and later included a technical development segment to help elevate club football in Guam.

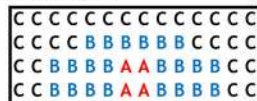


Goalkeeper 8 - 10 years old



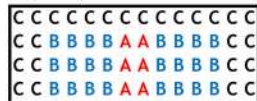
At this age, the goalkeeper will demonstrate the desire to make saves in area A and some saves in area B with improving technique and motor skills. No expectation for attempts or saves in area C.

Goalkeeper 10 - 12 years old



At this age, the goalkeeper should consistently make saves in area A, with a good success rate of clean saves in area B, with technique and good motor skills, leading with the hands. Goalkeeper should now be stepping into the save. No expectation for saves in area C.

Goalkeeper 12 - 14 years old



At this age, the goalkeeper must be consistent in making saves in area A. Clean saves in area B should be successfully, demonstrating good technique and good motor skills, leading with the hands, and stepping into the saves. Improved agility and quick feet will assist in occasional, but not expected successful saves to be observed in area C.



TECHNICAL: DEVELOPMENT

In an effort to further support elite youth player development, Guam Football Association fully committed to maximizing technical and financial assistance from FIFA through its FIFA Talent Development Scheme (TDS) and Talent Coach project in 2025.

Guam was part of the first batch of FIFA Member Associations to receive approval in its funding request through the FIFA TDS in 2022, initially to support youth clubs in creating better and sustainable environments for the development of elite youth players through the implementation of strategic plans and the appointment of club technical directors. GFA later was approved for additional funding to include the placement of a FIFA Talent Coach in Guam.

FIFA Talent Coach Philip Neiland was appointed to Guam beginning November 2024 for two years to support GFA's coaches in all aspects of elite youth talent development: identification of talents, training the talents, creating playing opportunities for talents, and the transition of talents to senior football in a tailor-made approach conducive to Guam's current football landscape.

The main goal of the FIFA TDS and Talent Coach project is to support GFA in becoming more competitive on the international stage with a dedicated long-term strategic plan, creating sustainability in the GFA elite youth development ecosystem.

GFA held a month-long trial session for youth players for the U14 and U16 Academy teams at GFA between January and February 2025. Later in February, coaches conducted trial sessions in two other venues: Talofofo and Tiyán.

To continue to promote football development among elite youth Academy teams, the U14 Boys National Academy team were officially registered to compete in the U16 Boys Division of the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League Spring 2025 season and entered again in the Fall season in the U17 Boys Division.

The U16 Boys National Academy team were registered to compete in the Budweiser G League Haya Division, Guam's top-flight domestic men's league, finishing half of the season.

The U14 Girls National Academy team are playing in the U17 Girls Division of the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League.

Later, the U16 Girls National Academy team will compete in the Bud Light G League Women.





Wings FC captured the inaugural Budweiser G League 2024 season title after a 3-2 win over NAPA Rovers FC Sunday afternoon in the league's championship match at the Guam Football Association National Training Center.

Simeon Packer, Yaw Boateng, and Yvan Tcheugoue each scored once in the win. Keyth Ordonez and Michael Castaneda scored for Rovers.

The 2024 season title is the Wings' second-straight of Guam's top flight men's football league.

Quality Distributors FC finished the 2024 season in third place after defeating the Bank of Guam Strykers FC 4-2 in a penalty kick shootout.

Following the matches, Wings FC were awarded the league's Champions trophy and gold medals in a short awards presentation event. The Rovers received the league's second-place trophy and silver medals, and Quality received the league's third-place trophy. Also receiving trophies were Yvan Tcheugoue (Wings FC) and Saena San Nicolas (NAPA Rovers FC), the league's Golden Boot and Golden Glove winners, respectively.

The next season began in April 2025 and will conclude in October. Wings FC and NAPA Rovers FC will be competing for the 2025 title, while Sidekick SC and Bank of Guam Strykers will play for third place.



NAPA Rovers FC completed a sweep of the 2024-2025 GFA Men's Futsal League awards, finishing with the Champions Trophy, Golden Boot, and Golden Glove awards Feb. 26 at the University of Guam Fieldhouse.

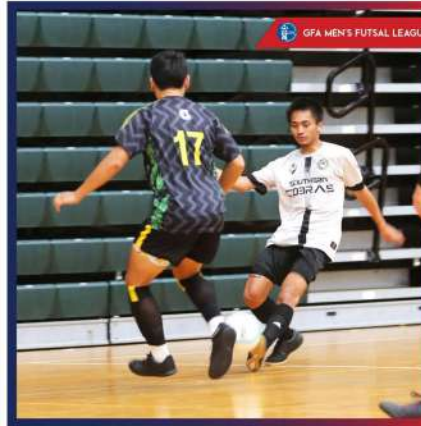

In the second part of 2024, Director of Referees George Stewart held five grassroots level referee courses for the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League and the interscholastic boys and girls leagues for middle schools and high schools.

Guam FA officially took overall responsibility of league scheduling, rules and regulations, and referee appointments of the newly combined Interscholastic Boys High School Football League in October 2024, while also hosting the semifinal, consolation and championship matches of the league at the GFA National Training Center. GFA partnered with Aloha Maid for league playoffs and featured a halftime "Aloha Maid Cash Grab" event for randomly selected spectators. Father Duenas Memorial School won the 2024 title.

In March 2025, Guam FA once again coordinated the Interscholastic Girls High School Football League and hosted league semifinals, consolation and championship matches at the GFA National Training Center. John F. Kennedy High School won the 2025 title.



Sixteen applicants were awarded with a total of \$16,000 from Guam Football Association's scholarships through its AHEAD Program in a presentation ceremony held in August 2024.

Eligible candidates were either Class of 2024 high school graduates entering college programs or current college students finishing credits to graduate.

Each recipient received a certificate of achievement with funding disbursed to their respective higher education programs. Scholarship donors also were recognized with certificates for their donations.

The GFA Football 4 Schools program continued in 2025 with the theme “Be Safe - Protecting Your Digital World”. Following the success of the 2024 program, a total of 25 elementary schools participated in the program, which culminated in the school-year ending Jamboree, featuring festival style matches for all school teams. Dominican Catholic School won the girls’ division and Tamuning Elementary School won the boys’ division.

In addition to the Jamboree, the local program also included regional round-robin matches and a social responsibility component that featured presentations at participating schools by program partners Guam Police Department and Guam Airport Police, as well as youth national team athletes as ambassadors and role models. The program also included equipment donation to the participating schools at the beginning of the 2024-2025 school year.

GFA partnered with KUAM to promote its 2025 theme campaign through PSA videos. Videos aired weekly on television and through GFA’s social media platforms. Schools were given .mp4 files to use in its curriculum.

On August 27, 2025, GFA was awarded an AFC Dream Asia Foundation Award for \$67,000 to fully support the school year 2025-2026 GFA Football 4 Schools Program.





In October 2024, visiting coaches from the Urawa Reds Heart-Full Club from Japan visited Guam to promote football fun at its heart: "Let's enjoy and learn the importance of sport, now!"

Close to 50 youth athletes from the U12 age category took part in the a special session at the GFA National Training Center and hundreds more enjoyed activities with coaches during elementary school visits.

In the summer of 2025, athletes from the U10 and U12 age categories took part in Pacific Grassroots Football Tournament with visiting teams from the Northern Mariana Islands.

Hundreds of youth players, coaches, and supporters converged at the Talofofu gym for opening day of the inaugural Sengsong Summer Slam Village Futsal Tournament on July 12, 2025.

The new summer event, organized by Guam Football Association in collaboration with five villages in its first iteration, began with three U10 matches and three U12 matches.



Matches were played in different village gyms, beginning with Talofofu Gym, then to Yigo Gym, Astumbo Gym, Tamuning Gym, and Hagat Gym.

"Youth futsal holds enormous potential," said Fred Alig II, GFA Executive Committee Member and Chairman of the GFA Futsal and Beach Soccer Committee. "Starting with players at 10 years old to 13 years old, we've seen tremendous interest from the kids and unwavering support from families and communities across the island.



"Most importantly, the players' development is evident - week after week, scores became tighter with no blowouts, all while camaraderie among teams grew. Overall, the teams delivered fast-paced, high-energy futsal from start to finish and their progress is only getting stronger. This is just the beginning and I am eager to see how far youth futsal can go," Alig added.







SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

In 2025, GFA once again organized equipment donations to schools taking part in the year's edition of GFA Football 4 Schools, while also donating equipment to the Department of Youth Affairs for sports activities for youth detained in correctional facilities. Equipment included footballs, mini goals, cones, and markers. Additional equipment was donated to schools winning the Football 4 Schools Jamboree, as well as an art contest for elementary school students delivering the 2026 program's message, "Be a Good Citizen."

Ahead of the 2025 GFA Football 4 Schools Jamboree, together with the Guam Police Department and Guam Airport Police, GFA visited all participating elementary schools to deliver the year's message about the importance of staying safe online and ways to reduce instances of cyberbullying. Youth national team players attended a media and communications workshop ahead of the school visits.

In November 2024, the Guam U17 National Team and Guam U17 Women's National Team training squads took part in a bus stop beautification project near Wettengel Elementary School. The U17 National Team squad did clean up around the area and its women's counterpart re-painted the bus stop. Guam Home Center and Home Depot all donated supplies for the beautification project including cleaning supplies and paint.

GFA CONGRESS 2024

Guam Football Association Member Clubs confirmed appointments for the GFA Electoral Committee and the GFA Disciplinary and Ethics Committee, both independent committees, at the GFA Ordinary Congress 2024 on Oct. 24 at the GFA National Training Center Lecture Hall. Special guests at the Congress included Ms. Bolor Bayarsaikhan from AFC.

Fred Horecky was confirmed to fill the current term vacancy until 2027 and will continue as Chairman. Jack Chan, Laura Dacanay, and Jordan Pauluhn were all confirmed unanimously as members of the GFA Electoral Committee for six years beginning 2025.

Former Deputy Chairman Dr. Hiro Kurashina opted not to re-submit his nomination for the Electoral Committee and the Congress confirmed the appointment of current member Brad Huesman as the new committee Deputy Chairman.

Dr. Hiro Kurashina was one of the original members of the GFA Electoral Committee formed in 2018 and was recognized with a plaque for his service.

Leonardo Rapadas was confirmed for the vacant seat in the GFA Disciplinary and Ethics Committee and will serve out the current term through to 2027.



FINANCE 2025

The AFC Central Review of funds disbursed during 2024 from the AFC Enhance Programme was conducted remotely by Annuity Consulting, based in Malaysia. Beginning in April 2025, the AFC auditor tested 100 percent of the disbursements and issued a satisfactory rating, indicating no findings across all 34 compliance checks.

The FIFA Central Review of funds disbursed during 2024 from the FIFA Forward 3.0 Development Programme was conducted remotely by FIFA's central auditor, Mazars USA LLP, beginning in March 2025. The Central Review resulted in zero findings raised by the FIFA auditor.

For the eleventh consecutive year, Guam FA successfully achieved a clean external audit opinion on its financial statements. In compliance with Guam Public Law 37-63, the audited financial statements were filed with the Guam Department of Revenue & Taxation (DRT) on July 23, 2025. Pursuant to Guam Public Law 27-85, Guam FA also submitted its financial statements to GEDA, OPA, and the Guam Legislature on July 25, 2025.

Guam FA further maintained its good standing as a Guam 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization and was included in the DRT 2025 Updated Non-Profit Listing as of June 2025.





Midway through 2024, GFA's solar energy system at the GFA National Training Center in Harmon was completely replaced, thanks in great part by a financial grant from FIFA Foundation. A ribbon cutting ceremony was held August 8, 2024 to celebrate the completion of the project by Pacific Solar & Photovoltaics, which now features more technologically advanced solar energy panels and an upgraded monitoring tool for cost savings.

The new solar energy system at GFA consists of 264 solar panels with an anticipated production of 98.4 kilowatts of energy. The new system's railing can withstand 195 mph windload.

Additionally, engineering work continues for the restoration of floodlights. Newer, more cost efficient lighting systems will be installed and poles able to withstand greater wind force levels (up to 210 mph windload) have been procured and installed to better protect the system during typhoons.

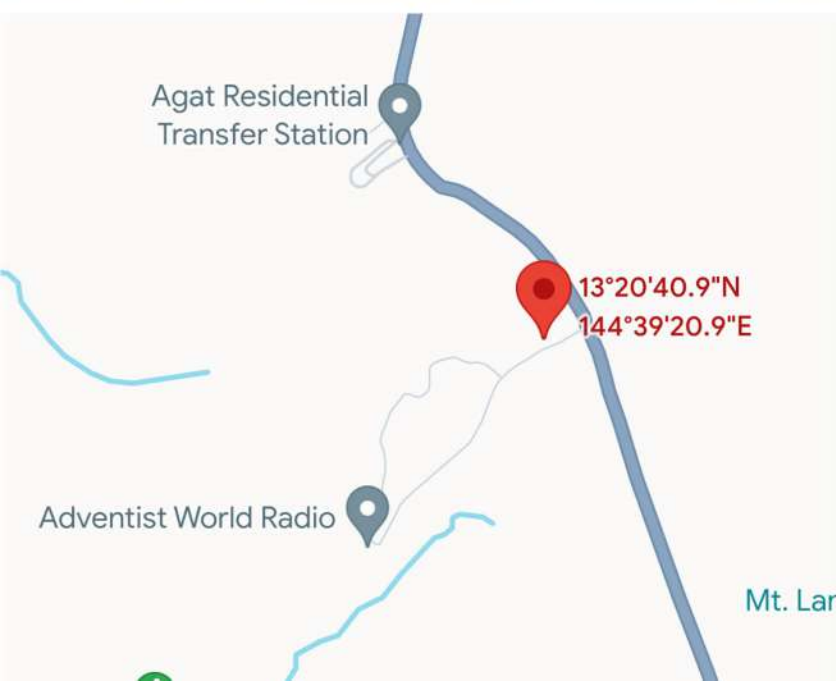




Guam Football Association ceremonially broke ground August 8, 2024 to signal the realization of the Speaker Vicente Pangelinan Southern Complex in Hågat, a facility that will include two full-size artificial turf pitches and an international futsal hall in construction plans.

GFA secured \$5.2 million in funding from FIFA Forward 3.0 after applying for infrastructure support from FIFA and officially made the announcement at a groundbreaking ceremony with over 50 in attendance, including visiting FIFA Development Officer Jun Chen, the Hon. Lou Leon Guerrero, Governor of Guam, senators, mayors, the family of the late Speaker Pangelinan, private sector VIPs, GFA Executives, and club representatives from the Southern Cobras and Southern Heat, among others.

Of the \$5.2 million, \$3.8 million was awarded to KIAN Construction for overall earthwork on the lot and \$770,873 for the installation of two turf pitches by Edel Grass B.V. \$413,966.71 was awarded to AM Orient for construction management and the remaining \$260,000 as a contingency.

In 2024, GFA's domestic leagues received a branding facelift implemented in the year's seasons.

The top flight leagues for men's and women's teams are now called G League and G League Women with Budweiser and Bud Light as naming rights sponsor, respectively. In addition to the rebranding, the league also was restructured, with the season featuring over 90 matches each and at least 10 teams.

In the recreational space, the Masters League is now called the Ma'gas Masters League and the summer Co-Ed Masters League is also under the Ma'gas name.

The former GFA Women's Recreational League is now called the Women's Recreational Latte League and the GFA Soccer Moms League is now called the Metgot Moms League.

The recreational names are from the Chamorro language:

- Ma'gas referring to the upper echelon of ancient Chamorro society
- Latte refers to the latte stone, which served as the structural foundation for ancient Chamorro houses
- Metgot refers to strength, in line with Guam's traditional matrilineal system that featured mothers at the head of the household in ancient Chamorro society

With GFA now at the helm of organizing schedules for the interscholastic high school leagues, uniting two separate leagues from previous years, new logos were created.

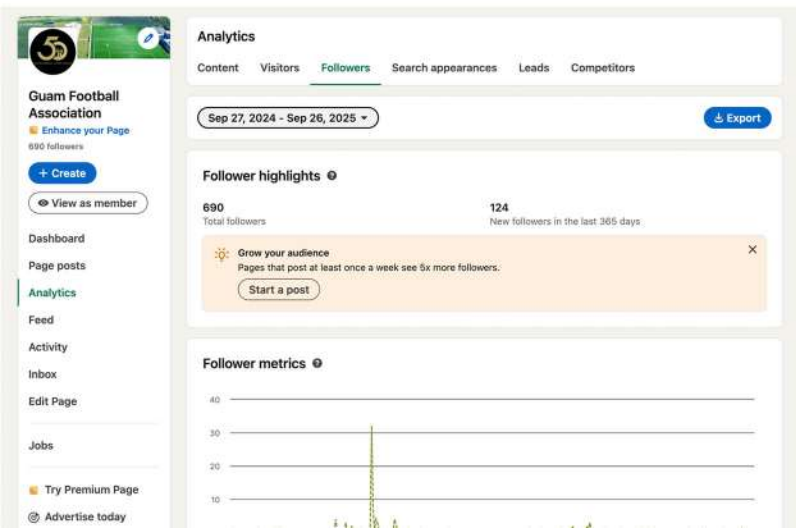

Guam Football Association is the official governing body for the sport of football in Guam.

Beginning in the summer of 2025, three new niche accounts were added to Guam Football Association's most popular social media platform, Instagram.

The main account, @GuamFootball is now utilized primarily for Guam National Teams content and GFA administrative and governance initiatives content.

An additional @GuamFootballWomen account was created to showcase all of Guam's women's and girls football content, not limited to all grassroots football level opportunities for girls and women, women's domestic leagues, and the women's teams in the Guam National Program. The account was well-received and had the quickest accumulation of followers among the three new accounts created on Instagram.

An additional @GLeagueGuam account was created solely for Guam's top flight adult leagues and the GFA Ma'gas Masters League. The account features results from the Budweiser G League, Bud Light G League Women, GFA Futsal League, GFA Women's Futsal League, and other tournaments/events featuring the first teams from GFA's Member Clubs.

An additional @GrassrootsFootballGuam was created for all of Guam's grassroots football initiatives, primarily the Triple J Auto Group Robbie Webber Youth League, GFA's portfolio of recreational adult and youth leagues, tournaments, and events, youth team level coaching courses from the YCC to the GFA "C" Coaching Diploma, and recreational league referee courses, among other content.

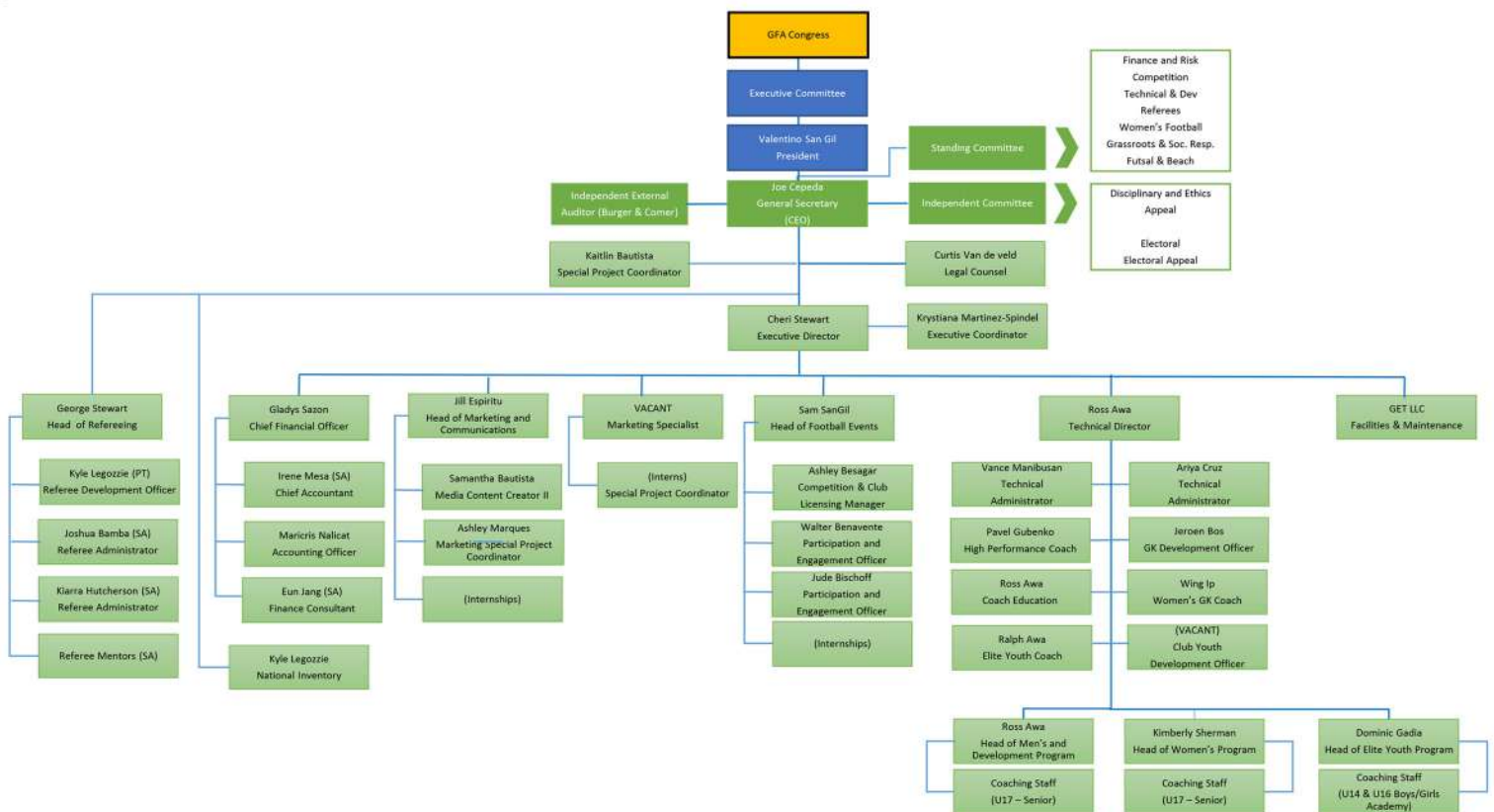

Stewart traveled to Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic in October for the FIFA U17 Women's World Cup Dominican Republic 2024™ and served as a Match Commissioner. Korea DPR are champions of the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup Dominican Republic 2024™ after edging Spain 4-3 in a penalty shootout following a 1-1 draw.

Timeline

- **1973** - Organization and hosting of Guam's first-ever soccer tournament - the Guam Soccer Cup, won by Southern Pacific, Inc.

- **1974** - Sport of soccer officially introduced into Guam's school system with John F. Kennedy High School Islanders winning the first-ever interscholastic league title



- **1975** - Guam Football Association officially founded with Charles Whang as the first president. "Charlie" is considered by many to be the father of soccer in Guam

- **August 1975** - Guam men's national team competes in its first international tournament, the 1975 South Pacific Games held in Guam. In its first match, Guam falls to Solomon Islands 5-1. Guam also played against Fiji a few days later in Group 2 play

- **1977** - Gov. Paul Calvo grants release of Harmon Loop government land to GFA



- **August/September 1979** - Guam men's national team competes in the SPG in Suva, Fiji. Guam reached the final of the consolation bracket, competing against New Hebrides (Vanuatu) for fifth. En route to the match, Guam defeated Samoa and Tuvalu. Guam men's team also played in 1991, 1995, and 2011

- **1990** - Robbie Webber Youth League officially kicks off with nine clubs and later recognized by the 21st Guam Legislature on May 2, 1991 with Bill No. 267 (COR)

- **1992** - Guam becomes a full member of AFC (Asian Football Confederation)



- **1994** - Guam Women's National Team first organized

- **1996** - Guam gains full FIFA membership



- **July/August 1998** - Guam men's national team wins the Micronesian Games football tournament outscoring opponents 52 to 4

- **1999** - Guam earns its first-ever win over a FIFA member nation when the Guam Women's National Team defeated Hong Kong, China 2-0 in the AFC Women's Championship Group Stage held in the Philippines

- **2000** - Guam competes in its first-ever FIFA World Cup Qualifiers

- **2001** - Richard K. Lai is officially voted in a GFA President; Lai held various committee posts in FIFA, AFC, and EAFF

- **2002** - GFA becomes a founding member of the EAFF (East Asian Football Federation)

- **July 2003** - Guam Women's National Team wins the silver medal at the 2003 SPG in Suva, Fiji, finishing with three wins (1-0 vs Fiji, 5-0 vs Kiribati, 1-0 vs Vanuatu), two draws (0-0 vs Tonga, 1-1 vs Tahiti) and one loss (1-0 to gold medalist PNG) *Guam rose to its highest FIFA ranking in history at No. 66 in the world*



- **July 2004** - Guam hosted first AFC U14 Boys Festival at LeoPalace Resort Guam

- **May 7, 2005** - Official inauguration of the GFA Headquarters, the first FIFA Goal Project completed in Guam

- **2006** - GFA hosted first Middle School Boys and Girls Festivals spearheaded by the late Muni Abdullah and Cheri Stewart



- **2008** - GFA established annual Sugar and Spice Middle School Girls Festival

- **March 2009** - Guam Men's National Team wins its first-ever match against a FIFA member nation since becoming a full FIFA member - a 1-0 win over Mongolia in the 2010 East Asian Football Championship Preliminary Round at LeoPalace Resort Guam. The team eventually qualified for the semifinal round of the tournament for the first time

- **September 12, 2009** - Official inauguration of the GFA Headquarters and Training Center with dormitories and classrooms, parking lot, futsal court and lights - Guam's second FIFA Goal Project completed

- **December 9, 2011** - Official inauguration of GFA lower turf and mini turf pitches, Guam's third and fourth FIFA Goal Projects completed



- **June 2012** - Guam national teams official adopt nicknames: Matao for the Men's National Team and Masakáda for the Women's National Team

- **November 2012** - Guam's U16 Women's National Team become the first National Team from Guam to qualify for the final round of an AFC tournament on its own merit (AFC U16 Women's Championship)

- **2013** - GFA launched first edition of its Moms League with ten teams spearheaded by Grace Martinez

- **March 2013** - Completion of Guam's fifth FIFA Goal Project - the GFA upper turf pitch



- **December 2013** - Completion of Guam's first FIFA Income Generating Program project - solar panel installation by Green Energy Solutions, Inc.

- **2014** - GFA adds an additional recreational league for women's teams, now called the Latte League to the Moms League (now called Metgot Moms)

- **March 2014** - Signing of MOU for the construction of GFA's southern facility in Hagat

- **June 2015** - Guam played host to its first-ever FIFA World Cup Qualifier home match and also won its first-ever FIFA WCQ match - a 1-0 victory over Turkmenistan. The Matao followed with a 2-1 win against India in Guam's second home match. Guam went on to play host to two more FIFA WCQ matches in the same round in September and November. *Guam rose to its highest men's FIFA ranking in history at No. 146 in the world*



- **February 2016** - GFA officially begins its sixth FIFA Goal Project, the construction of a third building for classrooms, locker rooms, a strength and conditioning gym, VIP viewing deck and seating, Live Stream broadcast platform, and production room

- **April 23, 2016** - GFA officially recognizes the completion of 40 years of football in Guam, achieved in 2015 with a Jamboree event and special awards

- April 2016** - GFA partners with Marvel Comics to bring Spider-Man to deliver an anti-bullying message to Guam's elementary schools in addition to hosting a football festival (precursor to Football 4 Schools)



- July 2016** - The Guam National Team automatically qualifies for the second round of the EAFF E-1 Football Championship for the first time based on its superior FIFA Coca-Cola World Ranking to Chinese Taipei

- August 2016** - The NAPA Rovers FC become Guam's first ever club team to compete in an international AFC tournament, competing in the AFC Cup Preliminary Round

- November 2016** - Kyle Legozzie and Shawn Spindel officially receive FIFA Assistant Referee badges, becoming the first from Guam to do so



- January 2017** - The Guam Budweiser Soccer League match between the NAPA Rovers FC and Guam Shipyard goes viral on the Internet when NAPA Rovers FC's Ashton Surber proposes to his then girlfriend with a message on his undershirt after scoring from a bicycle kick. The clip garnered one quarter of a million hits on GFA's YouTube page

- July 2017** - GFA holds an special Extraordinary Congress with an election for a new GFA President. Valentino San Gil wins with 7-6 majority.

- 2018** - AM Orient is selected to manage GFA properties following the acquisition of a property in Ordot-Chalan Pago and the signing of a legislative bill for a property in Talofofo. Plans for the Speaker Vicente Pangelinan Southern Complex continued.

- October 2018** - GFA achieves Bronze Level membership in the AFC Grassroots Charter
- October 2018** - GFA creates a new independent committee - the Electoral Committee with members elected by the GFA Congress to oversee future GFA elections

- December 2018** - GFA hosts Round 2 of the EAFF E-1 Football Championship for the first time, hosting the Women's Competition as a neutral venue.



- 2019** - Guam hosts three FIFA World Cup Qualifier matches, winning against Bhutan 5-0 in June, and falling to Maldives 1-0 and Philippines 4-1 in September. Before the June 2019 qualifier match, GFA unveiled its first-ever National Team crest

- March 2019** - GFA officially opens its Fitness Center at the GFA National Training Center

- August 2019** - NAPA Rovers FC is voted in as GFA's newest full member during Extraordinary Congress after provisional membership from 2016

- October 2019** - GFA signs an MOU with Special Olympics Guam to offer Unified Soccer for the first time to its athletes

- October 2019** - GFA garners the AFC Social Responsibility Member Association of the Year Award (Aspiring) with a \$15,000 prize

- December 2019** - GFA garners the AFC Member Association of the Year Award (Aspiring) for the first time



- 2020** - GFA activity is halted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Efforts throughout the year were focused on rebuilding the community in the aftermath of the pandemic, including donations to the Guam Memorial Hospital and other non-profit organizations, as well as local business partners.



- February 2021** - GFA Referee Handbook created; Referee Regulations released in August 2021

- April 2021** - Guam National Teams back in full training for upcoming tournaments, Matao compete in centralized matches for the FIFA World Cup Qualifiers (in China, PR for one match and UAE for the remainder of matches)



- July 2021** - GFA completes the construction of the Maintenance Compound at the GFA National Training Center thanks to assistance from AFC and UEFA Assist and made further upgrades with spectator bleachers at GFA's futsal courts in September, thanks to assistance from Smithbridge and Liang Corporation

- January 2022** - GFA's Internal Organization Regulations are ratified, GFA new standing committee members inducted in event at Hilton Guam Resort & Spa



- February 2022** - GFA ascends to Silver Membership in the AFC Grassroots Charter

- March 2022** - GFA creates its AHEAD program for athletes looking to continue their education past high school. The program also included an annual scholarship for deserving athletes

- April 2022** - Start of GFA four-year Strategic Plan organization; final document formally introduced in October for 2022-2026

- May 2022** - GFA organizes its first FIFA Football 4 Schools event with 16 elementary schools

- August 2022** - GFA offers Guam's first-ever GFA "C" Coaching Diploma Course, the pre-requisite for higher international licenses

- October 2022** - GFA sends its first-ever National Women's Futsal team to compete in friendly matches

against the Philippines, winning one of two matches

- April 2023** - GFA plays host to first AFC centralized competition in over 10 years: AFC U17 Women's Asian Cup™ Qualifiers with teams from Lebanon and Philippines

- May 2023** - Guam is ravaged by Typhoon Mawar; GFA floodlights and solar panels completely destroyed, halting nighttime events

- September 2023** - GFA opens its online GU Fan Shop, selling GFA merchandise and authentic jerseys

- November 2023** - GFA wins the AFC Member Association of the Year Award (Ruby) and AFC President's Recognition Award for Grassroots Football (Silver)

- December 2023** - FIFA President Gianni Infantino visits Guam, confirms support from FIFA Foundation to restore the Harmon facility following Typhoon Mawar



- March 2024** - GFA successfully works with IIAAG & ISA to combine high school football leagues

- August 2024** - GFA inaugurates completion of solar panel system through FIFA funding, celebrates groundbreaking for Speaker Vicente Pangelinan Southern Complex in Agat
